April Reynolds School Report Card	<ul> <li>RISE testing was determined to be "adequately" valid</li> <li>Emerson is on par with other comparable schools and is higher than the District average</li> <li>The results are viewable to the public through the district website and are easily found by googling "school report card"</li> <li>Math and Language Arts have shown positive growth; Math has remained flat <ul> <li>We are now 3 years post change in math core curriculum</li> </ul> </li> <li>English learners will look low on the report card, however the sample size (N) is too small.</li> <li>Consistent student attendance was noted</li> </ul>
