COVID19 Information (John)

 Mr. Kelly refers to the letters sent home via the district this morning about COVID19 and reminds parents to look for information coming from a district source updating them on the district's plans to address the safety of students and district personnel.

Staffing (John)

- Mr. Kelly updates the SCC on the new staffing plans for next year (2020-2021)
- Washington Elementary will not be doing splits next year, and instead will have two grade levels that have only one class.
- Kindergarten (2), First Grade (1), Second Grade (2), Third Grade (1), Fourth Grade (2), Fifth Grade (2), 6th Grade (2)
- Ms. True will be teaching first grade, Mrs. Moore will be teaching third grade. The large classes will be around 30 students in size.
- Washington Elementary will also have a half time behavior specialist and half time academic interventionists to assist the whole school and the larger classes.

Trust Land's Funds (Sarah/John)

- SCC discusses the benefit of paraprofessionals, specifically in the large classes
- Cherie Farnes motions to vote to fund paraprofessionals with the Trust Land's Funds
- Laurie Shea seconds that motion

- The vote is unanimously in favor of funding paraprofessionals with the Trust Land's Funds

IB Update (John)

- Washington Elementary has intentions to apply for IB Candidacy this year (June 2020)
- Sarah Kelly shows an IB Primary Years Program Overview video to help the SCC understand the various traits and elements of the IB PYP
- Mr. Kelly provides a timeline for implementing this program:
 - The IB PYP is not yet an approved program by the state board of education
 - Mr. Kelly will present this program to the board to gain approval (parents and community members are encouraged to attend this board meeting!)
 - If approved, WE would need to apply by June 1st and pay the \$4,000 application fee
 - Once applied, WE would become an "IB Candidate School" and have 3
 years to implement changes and work towards compliance with the PYP
 program in order to become an official IB school

- The first Art and Culture Committee meeting will be on March 19th at 3:00 PM in the Art Room
