# Admin Updates/Upcoming Events- Britnie

It has been a really busy month! Lots of overnight trips and field trips. As a kick off to chemistry's Down the Drain Project, students did a canoe trip to clean up trash on the Jordan River. They biked to the water treatment plant and are beginning to launch that work. Teachers ran a Rio Mesa trip, a Goshutes trip, a Cottonwood campout, trips up to Alta, and some college/post high school training trips have started up. There have been tons of bike rides, college essays and college applications are under way, and some really great cross-curricular projects. We held a successful FAFSA night last night. 9<sup>th</sup> grade interventions are in full swing for students struggling to achieve academic success (Friday Academy, Dream Team Fridays, counselor/student meetings. We've had several teacher lead professional developments on campus (strategies to support multilanguage learners, differentiation to meet the wide range of learning needs of our students). We've had a new opportunity launch last week with our after school programming, Coding in Minecraft. It's packed and students are earning either their Java or Python certification.
