  - i. School Safety and Digital Citizenship Receive & Discuss Reports
- HB 213: Safe Technology Utilization and Digital Citizenship in Public Schools (State Board Rule R277-491 requires and annual report)
- iBoss Internet Filter is utilized, Mrs. Candler receives a report of activity and she follows up individually with students and teachers if there is a concern
- Current filtering levels are differentiated between elementary, middle school, secondary

- YouTube is blocked for students but not faculty. Google Image searches are set to safe search
  mode, students are instructed to tell an adult if something makes them feel scared, unsure, or
  unsafe
- Students sign the Acceptable Use Policy upon registration and are taught the elements of the AUP each year in the library and in classrooms
- Devices used: laptops, touchscreen laptops, teacher iPads, kindergarten: student iPads to be used for Lexia, ST Math, Canvas, virtual science labs, BrainPop, Starfall, NewsELA, etc. at the discretion of individual teachers to meet curriculum needs
- If students are using computers/devices, they are to be supervised while utilizing technology
