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### Welcome

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Approve February Minutes	There was a delay in posting the March minutes to our website. SCC will defer approval of February minutes until April when they are available publicly.
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LandTrust Submission Delay	State LANDTrust website is not online yet so all submissions have been delayed.
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Land Trust	<p>District ESSER II Funds have been come available to fund positions supporting students. Previous vote for surplus/unspent LANDTrust funds was fund these support staff positions (ex. cafeteria, emergency substitutes). Now that we will have these positions covered by ESSER II funds, we can re-allocate these funds.</p> <p>Principal Smith proposed SLCSE-Bryant use funds to support literacy through Language Arts teaming. Sharing RISE data from 2018-2019, whole school average raw scores increased in all subject areas where teaming models were implemented. It was also shown through disaggregating the data that average raw scores increased in all demographic areas for the science and math tests and the vast majority of demographic areas on the English Language Arts test (a slight discrepancy was shown for students with disabilities and student who are not low income on the ELA test). Teaming is FTE-heavy because of the extra time this model requires. Clarifying questions from the Cynthia and Steve asked about the teaming model.</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Proposal to use additional LANDTrust funds to support teaming model FTE instead of student support salaries which are now covered by District ESSER II funds. Ed Munoz motion to approve, Steve Gibbon second. All in favor.</li></ul>
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Digital Citizenship Progress Check	<p>Beth Tanner provided update – committee continues to work off-line. Beth offered to send weekly tips to SLCSE-Bryant for social media posts about digital citizenship for parents.</p>
Recruitment and Enrollment	<p>Current enrollment is at 450 and if our 4 year enrollment trend continues we will come very close to maxing out our enrollment next year. Seventh grade enrollment was maxed out this year.</p> <p>Recruitment and enrollment is looking very good with many neighborhood schools returning to Bryant.</p>
Administrative Update	<p>After School Tutoring</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Currently after school tutoring is offered on Tuesday and Thursday.</li> <li>There is new funding available to expand the program. If enough students participate, we may be able to provide a second after school bus.</li> </ul> <p>Summer School Opportunities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>This summer, an expanded summer school program will be available. Teacher pay for this program will be boosted to support.</li> <li>Program would be 4-5 weeks long and cover all content areas. Proposed schedule would be from 9:00 a.m. to 3:30 p.m., four days per week.</li> <li>Currently in planning phase – information coming after Spring Break about how to sign up.</li> <li>Offered to in-coming 6<sup>th</sup> graders and 7<sup>th</sup> graders moving to 8<sup>th</sup> grade. Some 8<sup>th</sup> graders may choose to participate in summer program. Parent question from Idamae about how SLCSE will integrate summer school programs for in-coming 9<sup>th</sup> graders. SLCSE is in early planning phase and more info will be coming soon.</li> <li>Questions from Katherine Kennedy about how students will be invited to participate and whether out of boundary students can participate. Other schools are also looking at programs. Too soon to understand what “cap” might be. Parent question from Cynthia about transportation to summer school, which will be provided.</li> <li>Question about whether Diane Crim will participate in summer school. Community shared much praise for Diane’s career-long teacher-leadership role, and hopes she takes a well-deserved break.</li> </ul> <p>Enrollment Projection</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>See above.</li> </ul>
