- 1. Leanne Freedman motion to approve minutes from March. Patricia Christensen seconds. Unanimously approved.
- 2. Leanne Freedman motions to change meeting to May 13th. Principal Culley seconded. Unanimously approved.

Detailed Discussion:

- 1. Approved minutes from last meeting.
- 2. Proposed schedule change from May 20th until May 13th. Approved.
- 3. HB58 Plan 2020-2021. Julia Schleifman. Positive behaviors Plan. Many things paused by COVID, but many have gone on. Second Step SEL lessons were provided virtually. Shakespeare is happening. New Program: Life Skills Training- which is a research-based curriculum on tobacco, alcohol and substance abuse prevention. Provided in 6th grade, 11 lessons, started with 6th graders this year. Data will be collected on effectiveness through the SHARP survey (Survey that asks about peer pressure, substance use exposure and use.)
- 4. For 2021-2022 plan is to resume components of the previous plan. Continue Second Step SEL lessons. PBIS/MTSS will take form: Schoolwide expectations, reward system, Principal's 200 club. Continue Life Skills Training provided in 5th and 6th grade. Principal's 200 club is recognizing students for academic success or some positive behavior. Names drawn out of a bobcat jar, names are put on board and an activity with the principal.
- 5. School report (Principal Culley): Kindergarten open house very successful: 40 families came to first session. 15 came to second. Hoping that translates into enrollment. Shakespeare is happening. Girls on the Run is happening. Equity committee meeting every two weeks. 6th grade promotion is happening outside. Summer school with academic enrichment over the summer. Podding with Uintah for summer school. Using money to get at-need students tutoring over the summer to help with that. Options for math tutoring over summer. Jen asks if parents can keep Lexia/Zearn over the summer for supplemental catchup work. Culley says yes, he will make that happen and advertise to the community. Ms. Lofgren may open library to access to books over the summer. Deb says people are calling, interested in registering. Asks for anyone interested in registering to call the school. Encourage registration.
- 6. Bonneville Three Year priorities. Committee completed document, ratified Tuesday by faculty. Mr. Culley thanks committee for hard work. Will be sent out in newsletter this week to the community.
 - a. High Expectations for Students
 - b. Responding Effectively to Individual Needs
 - c. Collaboration with Families

- d. Provide a Safe, Healthy Environment.
- 7. Budget: Land Trust Budget for 2021-2022. Currently pay 0.5 FTE to prevent a funnel class in any grade. New allocation is \$56,836. Next year teacher will cost \$53,942. 6th grade will be a funnel class next year. Working with scheduling to do specials in the afternoon. 408 enrollment for next year. Funded for 458 students. So, we lost an interventionist and 0.5 FTE for sixth, likely for at least another year. Question about plans to expand enrollment from outside the neighborhood. Principal Culley says the problem is he doesn't want to attempt to take students from other SLC district schools because then it hurts their numbers and funding. There are two open enrollment windows. We do accept applications when they apply but we don't intend to take students from other schools.
- 8. Budget: Proposal for 2021-2022: Continue to support 0.5 FTE to prevent another funnel grade. Vote by email and sign and it will go to district.
- 9. Schedule Change for Bonneville next year: Because high schools are moving to 8:45am until 3pm, Bonneville needs to be on a common bus route. Currently we are 8:25-3:00pm. The School Board voted that all schools will be either one of two schedules. So, we may be moving to either 8:00-2:15pm, or 8:45-3:00pm. It is an SIC decision. More details to be decided.
- 10. Misty Morris is working on announcement for SCC Election set for week of May 17th- 21st, 2021.
