Minutes from our Nov. Meeting were reviewed. A change was made to reflect that Kristi Swett was attending as a non-voting School Board Member, the minutes were then approved.

Chairman Report – Anthony Moncur: He attended the large District SCC Chairpersons meeting and reported that they went over the District's school security measures.

Principal Report – Marian Broadhead: Schools emergency plan and training presentations were sent out to SCC members. She reported on a test of notifying classrooms with paper notes when the electronic communications are down – it was partially successful and will be modified in the future to work better.

There will be two assemblies on Feb. 19th Assemblies (one for upper and one for lower grades) for the whole school on Internet Safety.

Land trust monies – we should have enough for Math materials.

Marian updated us on the problem raised in our last meeting about the number of students in Room 1. Following the instructions from the District, Marian opened up a position for an additional teacher to help with student interventions. Camille Gallagher has taken that position and will be assisting with the Neighborhood Kindergarten class and instruction. She also informed us that Berkley has been hired as a Para-pro for Room 1, and told us how the budget was worked out to pay for these positions. We also discussed the Federal & State requirements for English Language Development instruction for students.

Class sizes will be a concern in the future, and we discussed how the situation may affect our various programs.
