### SIC / Counselor / School Representative Report:


8<sup>th</sup> grade pre-registration with Highland High went well.

- The big Shopko area project will be completed in 2019
- This summer of 2018, 1300 E between 1300 South to 2100 South will be under construction to replace the water pipe which dates back to 1908.
- Next summer, 2019 1300 E will be repaved.
- Wilmington between 1300 E and 100 E will also be repaved this summer.
- The 21<sup>st</sup> and 21<sup>st</sup> area was zoned so the giant apartment complex that had been proposed cannot be built.
- Foothill master plan is being studied and developed.

### **Principal Report:**

- School Improvement Plan & Land Trust Plan Progress we will continue 2018-19 SIP/School LAND Trust Process. However, there are some changes in the SIP for the next school year and moving forward.
- SIP is now Called the EEP (Excellence and Equity Plan)
- The EEP consist of 4 main areas:
  - Collaboration with families
  - Expectations for students
  - Respond to individual needs
  - Provide safe healthy environment
- Each school has been asked to target 3 main goals for each of these 4 areas and work toward these goals for 3 years, with an annual review.
- The EEP is due by March 23<sup>rd</sup>.
- Jane will type up the brainstorming from today's meeting and combine the ideas with the faculty ideas. Please review the photo embedded below to see the initial list.

- The EEP can be funded with Land Trust money.
- This school year 2017-2018 Hillside's Land Trust budget was \$54,000.
- Next school year 2018-2019 Hillside's Land Trust budget will be \$60,000.



### School Safety Plan:

- Every other month Hillside is required to perform a full evacuation fire drill
- Every other month Hillside is encouraged to perform an alternate drill, ex: gas leak, chemical spill, earthquake, etc.
- Beacon Heights Elementary on 2500 E is the main evacuation/reunification site.
- Fresh Market on 2300 East and Parley's Way is the secondary evacuation/reunification site.
- Once school has stared for the day, all doors except for main front door is locked.
- Teachers, custodians, and My Eyink are always walking the halls.
- Students cannot wear hoods or hats in the school for safety reasons. Students must be recognizable to faculty and staff at all times.
- It was suggested to have stanchions placed near the front doors to encourage visitors to walk directly to the office.
- Main lesson learned in last year's lockdown was communication took too long due to PowerSchool being overloaded as Highland High was having a lockdown at the same time.
- Jane reported it took nearly 15 minutes to get communication out. This was a PowerSchool issue.
- It was suggested to have a bell code system in place so bells could signal drills without the intruder or threat being aware of the communication.
- The district is looking into a communication app for emergency situations.
- There are 5 fire pulls in Hillside and none of them are located on the 2<sup>nd</sup> floor.
- There is a safety meeting at Highland High School on April 4<sup>th</sup> from 6-8pm open to the public to discuss safety.
