1. Welcome 9:00

Dr. Malouf welcomed everyone and thanked them for being at today's meeting.

2. Approval of Minutes from March SCC 9:05 Minutes from March SCC meeting approved.

# 3. Principal's Report

a. Students of the Month 9:05

Dr. Malouf stated students were nominated by their teacher for demonstrating this month's Social Emotional Learning theme: Proactive. These students did things before they were asked or saw things and jumped in. We are celebrating students who demonstrated being proactive. Our counselors will be visiting the students houses this week to celebrate with a delivery of a book. Dr. Malouf congratulated each of the students and a video was shown. We are proud of you! Thank you for all that you do to make Mountain View a wonderful place. Video will be shared on Facebook and with teachers to show their classes. Students were welcomed to logout out of zoom and rejoin their classes.

- b. Updates
  - a. All of our meals have been pork free, but the Child and Nutrition department is now offering a meatless lunch. Let your teacher or school office, or MVES Nutrition Supervisor know. This is not available for breakfast at this time.
  - b. At board meeting, two things were approved.
    - i. High schools late start was approved to start next year. High Schools will start at 8:45. That will have an impact on all of the other schools (MS and ES) but we do not know this at this time. We may go back to an 8:00 start and will let you know once we this information has been confirmed.
    - ii. Next Friday at same time and on same link. At that time, transition students from Glendale to East but will provide information about this late start.
    - iii. The district has approved an online only elementary school. For families that choose this, it would be for a full year commitment. No schools will be offering the in person and remote learning. Mountain View will be all in person next year. If you choose to enroll in the online only school, it would be separate from Mountain View.
  - c. Another item Dr. Malouf wants you to be aware of, the state mask mandate will be lifted on Saturday, but that does not apply to schools. All schools in the state will still be under a mask Mandate until June 15<sup>th</sup>. Parent shared Salt Lake City will still be under a mask mandate. We will require students to continue to wear masks at Mountain View. On Monday, there is a movement to come to school without a mask. We will not allow students in the building without masks and will continue to provide them for those who come without a mask.

- 4. Testing Updates and Preparation 9:20 Assistant Principal Wowczuk

Testing- Measure what students know and can do. Teachers use data to adjust planning and instruction.

Acadience (K-6 <sup>th</sup> Grade)
Reading Assessment given three times a year
Measures if students are on target to reading on grade level
Interims (K-12 <sup>th</sup> Grade)
Math, Language Arts, and Science content assessments given throughout the year
Computer based
Measures students understanding on certain content topics
WIDA (ELL students K-12 <sup>th</sup> Grade)
Language Proficiency Assessment done in January/February
4 Parts: Reading, writing, speaking, and listening

Provides information regarding what supports students need in their homeroom and ELD classes If a student tests out, they are monitored in case they need additional support

### Rise (3-8<sup>th</sup> Grade)

End of year state assessment

Content Areas: Math, Language Arts, Science (4-8<sup>th</sup> grade), and Writing (5<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade)

Computer Based Cumulative Assessment- measures students understanding and growth for the content area information for the whole year

End of Levels (1<sup>st</sup> and 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade)

Computer assessment

Kindergarten Entry and Exit Placement

Measures students' growth on numbers, letters and sounds, and oral language

Done one-on-one in person with the teacher. Two days in May (16 and 18) where there will be no classes and families sign-up for a testing slot

# **Test Preparation**

Three most important things: Come prepared (charged device), get a good night's sleep and eat a healthy breakfast, remain positive. All we ask is that our students try their best and show us what they know. You will see information on your student's teacher's weekly newsletter about when their class is schedule to test. All tests need to be in person, remote students will come in and test with their class or the teacher may arrange testing on a Wednesday.

Questions: Did you start testing starts next week? For a few classes, most classes will begin at the end of the month. You will see the schedule on each teacher's newsletter. If you have heard anything already, some classes are using the practice tests to become familiar with the tools and features. Instructional time is very precious, but we want to make sure when the test begins students are trying to figure out the features.
