# SIC Report:

Teachers on the SIC discussed:

- The Halloween parade outside was a great success and they would like to do it again next year.
- Holiday sing-along instead of doing it inside this year, they are looking at a way to do it electronically over the broadcast.

## Principal's Report:

- The annual Dia de los Muertos (Day of the Dead) celebration went well outside last Saturday.
- The food drive is all online donation instead of bringing cans into the school. The goal is \$2,000.
- Staffing is still an issue still looking for a PE teacher and some paraprofessionals.
- April reported on her trip to DC to receive the Blue Ribbon School Award.

## Safe Technology and Digital Citizenship Policy

• Utah law and State Board of Education Administrative Rule requires the SCC to review this, and April reviewed the components including filtering and the varying settings depending school level.

- Every year there is a presentation (NetSmarts) done in an assembly, one for lower grades and one for upper grades. It is an engaging and informative assembly that teaches kids about internet safety. They are discussing whether to do this as an assembly or in smaller groups this year.
- If kids access inappropriate material, April approaches it as a learning opportunity to let kids know about the issue. She informs them how the system tracks their ID number and activity and it is monitored. She also informs parents that she had a conversation with the student, informing them that if it happens again, they may have their device or privileges revoked. If there is a second time, there can be more disciplinary action. There have been no incidents this year. Last year there were more since students were on devices a lot more.
- Emerson is not a 1-to-1 device school. There are devices in classrooms, the computer lab, and the library.
- April reviewed the software that is used at the school.

#### Safe Assemblies at Emerson Discussion

- April asked how parents are feeling about having assemblies?
- Several people at the meeting were hesitant to go ahead with the assemblies, particularly just a blanket approval of all assemblies in general.
- Some suggestions included doing smaller groups maybe grade-level assemblies, similar to lunch, and that masks would have to be required.
